CLINICAL UPDATE

ATICUS Network Reaches Major Milestone



Cure Leukaemia is delighted to announce the appointment of Kirsty Thomas as the first National Project Lead for The ATICUS Network (Accelerating Trials in Children Undergoing Stem Cell Transplant) – a major milestone in the mission to improve outcomes for children battling blood cancer.

Kirsty's appointment marks the transition of The ATICUS Network from an ambitious vision into an operational reality. Kirsty will lead the strategic rollout of the network across 11 leading children's hospitals throughout the UK.

Her role will focus on coordinating research infrastructure, integrating specialist research nurses, strengthening collaboration between hospitals, and helping to remove barriers that can delay access to paediatric clinical trials.

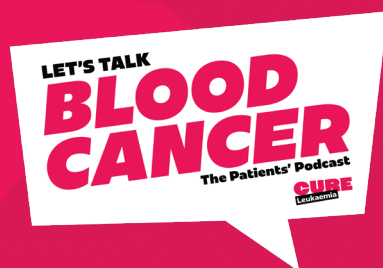
Cycling Through Treatment, Neil Morris

The Tour 21 In Partnership with Flutter Entertainment Is Underway

15 riders set off from Barcelona, taking on every Tour de France stage a week ahead of the pros. Facing extreme heat, tough climbs and 2,000+ miles of cycling, they aim to raise **£1 million** to fund clinical trials giving blood cancer patients access to life-saving treatments.

This month, 20 female amateur cyclists will tackle every stage of the Tour de France Femmes one day ahead of the professionals. Together, they are aiming to raise **£250,000** in support of children battling blood cancer.
